

Jay Jones
Rhode Island College Head Coach

Jay Jones is currently in his 18th season as Rhode Island College's head wrestling coach. He also serves on the Executive Committee for the NCAA Div. III Wrestling Coaches Association. He owns a 217-154-1 (.585) career record.

In the past 17 years, Jones has coached one National Champion, seven All-Americans, 64 All-New England wrestlers, eight New England Champions, 19 national qualifiers and 18 Academic All-Americans. In addition to his coaching duties, Jones is an English teacher at Cranston West High School.

Tyler Grayson
Brown Assistant Coach

Grayson began his coaching career with the Bears in late August of 2011. A four-year letter winner at Central Michigan, Grayson was an NCAA Qualifier (Round of 12) in 2010 with the Chippewas and a 2010 Mid-American Conference Champion. He lastly served as an assistant coach at Neosho County Community College in Chanute, Kan., a program that boasts eight National Championships and 45 All-Americans at the JUCO level.

At Central Michigan, Grayson compiled 31 wins in his first three seasons. His senior year he finished with a 20-7 overall mark and 13-2 dual meet record on his way to a conference championship at 165 pounds.

Jon Gingrich
Brown Assistant Coach

Jon Gingrich, a part of five NCAA Championship team titles at Penn State University, entered his first season with the Brown University wrestling program as a volunteer assistant coach in 2016-17.

Gingrich helped the Nittany Lions win both the NCAA team title and the Big Ten team title in 2011, 2012, 2013, and 2014 as a wrestler before aiding PSU to another NCAA championship as a resident

athlete with the Nittany Lion Wrestling Club in 2016. Gingrich completed his collegiate career with an overall record of 71-23 (.755 winning percentage). As a redshirt-junior in 2013-14, he posted a 23-10 mark, qualified for the NCAA Championships, and earned a ranking as high as No. 12 by Internat.



Jay Weiss
Harvard Head Coach

The two-time EIWA Coach of the Year has mentored two national champions, 17 EIWA champions and 19 All-American's during his 22 seasons at the helm of the Crimson, creating a culture of excellence never seen before.

Under Weiss's tutelage in 2016, Harvard sent three wrestlers to the NCAA Championships, including Devon Gobbo '16, Josef Johnson '18 and Todd Preston '16. Gobbo and Preston also garnered All-Ivy first-team accolades, with Gobbo winning the EIWA title at 165 lbs.

Weiss was named the Wrestling USA 2008 Massachusetts Person of the Year. He received the honor not only for his coaching at Harvard but his support and development of the sport on the youth level. His work with Massachusetts Junior

National team and clinics has raised the level of training, technique and competition throughout the state.

John Archambeau
New England College Head Coach

John Archambeau has the rare distinction of being the first head coach of not one, but two collegiate wrestling programs in New England. He started the Daniel Webster program in 2014. With news of the college shutting its doors, Archambeau has since taken on the task of building a new program at New England College.

Archambeau is a native of Ludlow, Mass. and was a collegiate wrestler and assistant coach at Springfield College. Archambeau excelled for the Pride, earning NEWA All-Conference honors in both 2010 and 2011.

Archambeau also holds the rank of Second Lieutenant in the United States Air Force in the 42nd Aerial Port Squadron and has served his country for five years which has included two tours in Afghanistan.

Dave Dubin
Co-Owner and Coach at CrossFit Firewall

As a wrestler at Holliston High, Dave was an All-State Champion and pinned an astounding 4 state champions in the New England Tournament on his way to a 3rd place finish.

Dave went on to Springfield College where as an underclassman he wrestled for Coach Jason Holder in addition to playing football for the Pride. He competed at a very high level in CrossFit at Springfield and that became his passion. In 2014, he was ranked as high as 27th in the Northeast Region and 407th worldwide.

Dave has since started his own business in CrossFit Firewall located in Holliston, MA.
